

founding chancellor, set a daunting goal: Create the best community college district in the United States. Dallas College is one of the largest community colleges in Texas, and since 1965, has helped almost 3 million people on their educational journey.

Since its formation, **Dallas College Richland Campus** has focused on teaching, learning and community building. Richland's richly diverse student population provides a global experience to enhance students' future success in the broader world community.

Dallas College Richland Campus was founded in 1972 and is the largest campus in the college, featuring about 20,000 students. Located on the old Jackson farm, the campus comprises 155 acres including Thunderduck Lake.

Chamber board member, Dr. Kathryn K. Eggleston, serves as president of Richland. She joined Dallas College in 1973 as a faculty member for associate nursing degrees.

Today, Richland houses cutting-edge science teaching labs designed by faculty and science lab experts and cutting-edge advanced manufacturing, electronics technology and engineering labs using contemporary industry-standard equipment.

In 2005, the Richland Campus became the first community college to receive the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award.

It has been designated as the first two-year institution in Texas as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance Education (CAE2Y) for academic years 2011-2016. CAE2Ys receive formal recognition from the U.S. government, as well as opportunities for prestige and publicity for their role in securing our nation's information systems.

In 2013, Dallas College Richland Campus developed a skill standard for Digital Forensic Technician. Its Cyber Security program was recognized by the Texas Skills Standard Board (TSSB) as the first and only institution in Texas to meet this statewide standard.
