## PPP loan questions, answered through the US Chamber of Commerce

The federal Paycheck Protection Program offers forgivable loans to small businesses, but it has been changed several times. PPP loans are issued by private lenders and credit unions, and then they are backed by the Small Business Administration (SBA). The basic purpose of the PPP is to incentivize small businesses to keep workers on payroll and/or to rehire laid-off workers that lost wages due to COVID-19 disruptions. As long as businesses spend their loan money correctly, the full amount can be forgiven.
