Dean Kamen, inventor of Segway and wearable infusion pump

Renowned inventor and advocate for science to keynote Richardson Chamber annual meeting

The inventor who expanded the frontiers of health by creating the first wearable infusion pump for the treatment of various diseases will deliver the keynote address at the 2022 Richardson Chamber of Commerce Annual Meeting. Dean Kamen, who has more than 1,000 patents, will talk about his entrepreneurial spirit and drive to change peoples' lives, his many inventions and his passion for helping young people discover the exciting world of science and technology.

The annual luncheon meeting is set for April 19 at the Richardson Renaissance Hotel. Check-in begins at 11 a.m. In addition to the

address, several awards will be announced including the 2021 Citizen of the Year and volunteer recipients. The 2021 Board Chair Eric Peltier will hand the leadership of the chamber to 2022 Board Chair Manasseh Durkin.

"Dean Kamen's work as an inventor and health care advocate has dramatically changed the world in which we live," said Peltier. "We are excited to return to our first in-person annual meeting in two years and see some of his amazing devices first-hand. As we recognize our 75th Anniversary this past year and our deep roots within the Tech Corridor, I don't think we could have found a better speaker!"

Kamen invented his wearable pump while an undergraduate in college, which lead to the founding of his first medical device company, AutoSyringe, Inc in 1976. Shortly afterwards, he created the first portable insulin pump and then at the age of 30, sold AutoSyringe to Baxter Healthcare Corporation.

He formed his current company, DEKA Research and Development Corporation and continued to invent life-changing devices. Additional inventions include the peritoneal dialysis system, an advanced prosthetic arm, the Hydroflex™ surgical irrigation pump, the Segway, and the iBot wheelchair, which allows user to rise to 6 feet.

It was his work as an engineer and inventor that lead to his founding of "For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology, or *FIRST*®, which is dedicated to motivating the next generation to understand, use and enjoy science and technology. Started in 1989, *FIRST*® will serve more than one million young people across the globe who have applied for more than \$80 million in college scholarships this year.

Summer internship program needs employers and sponsors

Connecting teens -- and perhaps your future employees -- to a successful future, the Richardson Mayor's Summer Internship Program is now accepting business applications.




In its fifth year, the program immerses current high school juniors who attend Richardson ISD or live in Richardson into the professional workplace with internships at coveted businesses, nonprofits and government agencies. The program, which runs June 6-Aug. 5, is presented by Mayor Paul Voelker and the City of Richardson, Richardson ISD and the Richardson Chamber of Commerce.

Chamber members are encouraged to hire or sponsor an intern, as well as volunteerto help coach and critique students in the areas of professional etiquette and dress, resume development, interview preparation/mock interviews, and business communication.

New this year, the program will offer paid and unpaid internships, providing more opportunities for students to experience first-hand a career they want to explore. The internships – available in technology, manufacturing, communications, professional services, architecture, construction, philanthropy and more – will range from 10-to-40 hours per week.

Businesses also can sponsor an intern at a participating nonprofit, where students can learn about the important role nonprofits play in keeping a community vibrant and healthy.
