### Fab to add 500 jobs Richardson will be home to TI's new 300mm wafer manufacturing site

Texas Instruments will expand its presence in Richardson with its new wafer manufacturing facility.



The new facility is expected to create more than 488 jobs and represent more than \$3.1 billion in capital investment.

The 300mm analog wafer fabrication facility will be built on W. Renner Road, between Custer Parkway and Alma Road next to its current Renner Road facility. The current Richardson manufacturing facility has about 800 employees; TI employs 9,000 in Texas.
