

# Legislative update

Bills target in-state tuition for undocumented students, lawmakers debate property tax bills, deadline this Friday

House bills would repeal in-state tuition for undocumented students who graduate from Texas high schools. A study released last week found that Texas could lose \$400 million in Texas economic activity, or additional consumer spending from increased income, in the first year if lawmakers pass the bills. Friday is the deadline for legislators to file bills.
