Walking into <u>Richardson Bike Mart</u> feels more like stumbling into a cyclist's fever dream. Clusters of bicycles line the walls, the floor and even hang from the ceiling.

At any given time owner and President Woody Smith said at least 1,000 bicycles are ready for purchase. Combine that with the roughly 500 warehoused bikes waiting to be assembled and another 1,500 housed at nearby locations, and what results is a companywide inventory that rivals shops nationally and perhaps even globally, Smith said.

<u>Study finds Richardson's cultural arts sector a multimillion dollar</u> business

Richardson is often perceived as a tech-powered machine. But behind the city's digital facade is a bustling cultural arts community advancing the city's knack for innovation.

In 2015 national nonprofit Americans for the Arts released a study that quantified the economic impact of dollars spent in Richardson by arts and cultural organizations and their audiences amounted to \$20.6 million. Revenue to local government came in at \$831,000, while the state collected over \$1 million.
