Texas legislature session a wrap

Legislators make deal on budget, public school finance and property tax reform

Stay tuned for our Legislative Wrap-Up. We'll tell you what you need to know about action on key priorities this session.

These bills have been sent to Governor Greg Abbott and must be signed by him to be made law.

- Included in HB3 was \$6.5 billion to improve public education and pay teachers, plus \$5.1 billion to lower school district taxes. Though the bill provides funding for pay raises, a mandated teacher raise was not included.
- Property tax reform: voter approval would be required when local governments want to increase property tax revenues by more than 3.5%.
- Raising the age to buy tobacco products from 18 to 21, except military personnel.

City council election results One race in run-off; former Chamber board chair Hutchenrider gains seat compiled from Community Impact/City of Richardson

Richardson City Council will gain three new members as a result of this year's election, but the question of who will fill one of those seats will not be answered until next month.



The newly elected 2019-21 City Council members have been sworn into office, except Place 3.

Returning City Council members are Mayor Paul Voelker

(Place 7), Bob Dubey (Place 1), Mark Solomon (Place 2) and Steve Mitchell (Place 6). New to the City Council are Kyle Kepner (Place 4) and Ken Hutchenrider (Place 5).

One race will go to another round as none of its three candidates polled more than 50 percent of the vote. Dan Barrios and Janet DePuy were the top two vote-getters in the race for Place 3 and will face each other in a runoff election on June 8.
