# Architecture and Construction Careers academies kick off first school year

The inaugural freshman class of the Architecture and Construction Careers Academies at Richardson and Lake Highlands high schools is under way.



This group of students will be the first to graduate four years from now with the new curriculum that includes 60 hours of dual credit. They will exit high school with an associate's degree and be ready to join the workforce. Compensation for these new hires is expected to be in the mid-\$30,000 range, and they will not have any debt from school.

## Empty office buildings chip at Richardson's commercial occupancy rate

Roughly 15% of Richardson's 23 million square feet of office space was available for lease in the second quarter of 2019, according to commercial real estate database CoStar. The city's vacancy rate is compounded by several large office buildings that are either totally empty or contain large swaths of contiguous vacant space.

According to CoStar, there are 19 buildings with at least 50,000 square feet of available space. Ten of those buildings have more than 100,000 square feet of vacant space. These commercial vacancies are more a sign of success than failure, said John Jacobs, executive vice president of economic development at the Richardson Chamber. Available space is key to maintaining a healthy and thriving market, he said.

"The analogy I make is if I'm running a car dealership, I want my parking lot full of cars ready to sell." he said.
